This Prize is awarded to individuals who have made valuable years of research or outstanding cumulative achievements that have contributed to the science or industry related to rubber. The prize was established in 1957 as a fund of \$2,500 donated by his widow to The Chemical Society of Japan through The Society of Rubber Science and Technology Japan (SRSTJ) in 1957 to commemorate the late George Oenslager, an authority on the U.S. rubber industry who had taught rubber technology in Japan. Initially, it was awarded as a joint award by The Chemical Society of Japan and SRSTJ, from the first meeting in March 1958 to the 20th award in March 1996. After that, SRSTJ decided to select and present the award independently.
